FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Renovation works were carried out at MoCoCo House and at MCC, we refreshed the aesthetics of the building, and new equipment was purchased.

Our goal is to keep modernising while preserving 'a welcoming' environment for both churchgoers and the general public.

Finally, 2024 is almost here. We are eager and full of expectation as a congregation for what the Lord has in store for us. We are grateful that the members of our congregation are seekers after God and yearn to experience more of His presence. We hope and pray that as time goes on, we too start to notice this in our kids and young people.

Thank you to all leaders and partners who took time to produce reports used in this report and for our administrator - Mary for compiling and editing it!

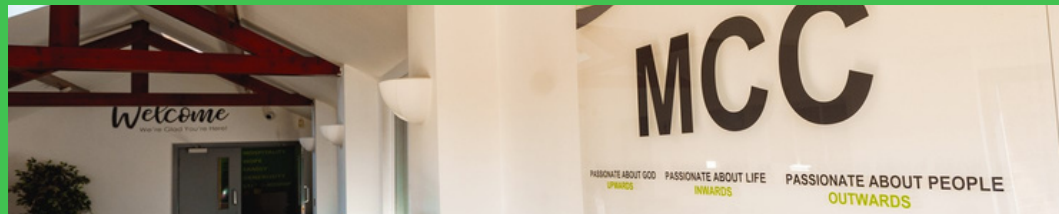

INTRODUCTION

Middlewich Community Church continues to serve the community in diverse ways, drawing its committed and enthusiastic congregation both from its hometown and the adjacent communities of Winsford, Holmes Chapel, Sandbach, Northwich, Knutsford, Nantwich, Crewe, surrounding villages, and hamlets. Our Objectives as a church may be described as follows:

- Advancing the Christian Faith in accordance with our statement of faith.
- Providing Service that brings health to people, by helping them spiritually, physically, financially, mentally where we deem necessary, by focusing on our vision, mission, core values and DNA.
- Providing facilities that help train and advance education within our community as we deem necessary.

The trustees wish to put on record their appreciation to the congregation, who have remained faithful throughout another year. Churches such as MCC depend on the commitment of both its staff and members to ensure that its programme is carried out. In particular the work of volunteers, i.e. partners who call MCC their spiritual home, is greatly appreciated.

The cornerstones of the regular church programme are the Sunday service, midweek life groups, prayer meetings, the children's & youth ministries serving both church families & the wider community. The church successfully operates two areas of activity in addition to its regular church services. Canalside conferencing continues to be a prime facility for day conferencing within the local community. Our Conference Manager continues to deliver a higher level of service to our clients which amongst others include local authorities, Police, NHS and businesses.

MoCoCo House was birthed out of a desire to provide safe accommodation for vulnerable young people. After several years, the facility is proving its worth, and does its best to achieve a high occupation rate. The semi-independent housing has proven essential over time in addressing the needs of both local vulnerable youth, primarily from Cheshire, and those who came to the UK unaccompanied as asylum seekers. Our personnel are highly regarded within the care community, and we are glad to be able to address these demands at this time.

MCC continues to help and support projects and personnel locally as well as working in different parts of the world. This has included, but not limited to, supporting the local foodbank and mission work in Eastern Europe and Africa.

Finally, MCC continues to be a key member of Churches Together in Middlewich, being involved with various initiatives throughout the year. The trustees consider the church to be in a strong position right now, ready to carry on serving the local community and everyone who considers Middlewich Community Church to be their spiritual home.

STATEMENT OF FAITH

DIVINE HEALING – in deliverance from sickness, by Divine Healing that is provided for in the Atonement.

BREAKING OF BREAD (COMMUNION) – all who have truly repented and believe in Christ as Lord and Saviour should regularly participate in Breaking of Bread.

RESURRECTION OF ALL WHO TRULY BELIEVE IN JESUS CHRIST – we believe in the bodily resurrection of all men, the everlasting conscious bliss of all who truly believe in our Lord Jesus Christ and the everlasting conscious punishment of all whose names are not written in the Book of Life.

The Conference Centre runs throughout the week here at MCC. 2022-2023 was a good year for Canalside, with many new clients coming to use the centre. It was also good to have our previous clients returning, some monthly, to do their regular training with us.

Over the past year, the Canalside team has increased their support in assisting to set up events and serving at church meetings. The team have had the pleasure of dressing the venue and being part of both Caz and Simon's wedding, and Julia and Lee's blessing. We are looking forward to the coming year.

God has been good to us, and we praise God for all he is doing.



MOCOCO HOUSE

KEVIN PEPPER (SERVICE MANAGER)

MoCoCo House continues to be recognised within Cheshire as an excellent supported accommodation service for young people. We have continued to remain at full capacity, and the service continues to be well sought after. This year we have been preparing for registering with Ofsted, and we have been working to ensure all documents are going to meet the requirements set by them. Through this process, we have implemented many new documents in preparation for that registration process, which we hope to complete before the new year. We are confident that the service will meet the required standards upon inspection. As in previous years, we continue to improve our service delivery, always striving to make positive changes to the young people's lived experience of MoCoCo House. As part of this registration process, I need to complete the statutory 'Registered Service Manager' application, and at the time of writing I am currently preparing.

MOCOCO HOUSE

We have made some significant changes to the building, where a staff bedroom and new manager office have been created, which has allowed us to accommodate more support staff to provide services to young people.

The changes we have made have been positively received by the young people, staff, and the professionals we work with day to day, making the service function more effectively.



Over the summer the young people have enjoyed trips to the cinemas, bowling and a beach trip, and further outings are planned for the autumn/winter.

We are pleased that 8 out of the 9 young people we currently support have enrolled into college and are engaging well to better their futures. We have now introduced a weekly study evening for those going to college, along with the weekly house meal and other activities.

The staff team continue to be well supported and developed in their roles at all levels, which is the key to great success within this sector. The staff work very hard as a team dealing with many complex issues day to day, whilst always keeping their spirits high, and maintaining good staff moral overall. MoCoCo House staff really do make real positive outcomes for the young people we support.



We wish to take this opportunity to thank the church for their continuous support and encouragement, and in 2024 it is envisioned that we are going to create further links with the church, by implementing a mentoring team, which we find very exciting.

TOWARDS THE FUTURE

In 2022, we moved from renting the church building on Brooks Lane to owning it. God has blessed MCC with assets and it is our intention to be good stewards for what He has bestowed on us. In the previous reports, we called this Hurdle 1, and we have now cleared it. We have ensured that the church's assets are well managed by those qualified to do so. This leaves the pastorate focussing on spiritual matters, of which is the main reason of the church.

The second Hurdle was previously titled Preparation of Growth, with the following targets:

a) Spiritual Growth

Within the past 12 months we have had targeted courses, such as, Freedom in Christ. The uptake has been satisfactory to good, and we feel we are going in the right direction. Our services are usually Spirit led with members of the congregation taking part. The focus on prayer is on the increase and we are currently preparing to host a Worldwide House of Prayer meeting.



b) Financial Growth

The church giving, saw an increase from last year. Maturity in the Christian context is directly proportional to giving, or simply moving away from being self-centred or stingy, to realising we have to give, because Christ gave. We give freely and it is encouraging to see the church giving increase. The financial management of the trust has also improved with a professional accountant now doing our books. This takes away all the risk from the church that financial management carries.

c) Numerical Growth

We are growing and the church seems to be attracting new people week in week out. The goal is to develop a process to ensure that church attendees settle quickly into the church. Without this process, our experience is, they will feel as if they are just a number and will not commit or even return. After attending our church for more than a couple of times, new attendees are usually invited to attend the Foundation course. The aim of the course is to lead the new attendees into being regular attendees and being partners. We have had approximately 20 people take up the Foundation course within the past 12 months.

Although we are still completing the Hurdle 2 phase, the Hurdle 3 phase: Growth, has begun. In spring 2024, we will be planting a new church in Sandbach. It is our hope to establish an AoG church in Sandbach and we are thrilled about the opportunity. As a church we are anticipating 2024 to be a year of growth.

OUR REGULAR EVENTS



TIMES OF REFRESHING

The church has been meeting and seeking the face of the Lord, on the first Tuesday of the month. We feel and sense the need to increase these meetings, but it is a balancing act with the Life Groups meetings, as we are keen for them to flourish. Participation by the attendees at the Times of Refreshing meetings has been wonderful as we are led by the Holy Spirit in prayer.

We recognise that prayer in our church and our personal lives is our lifeline. Without prayer we will not get far – we are on sinking ground, and so, all who call Middlewich Community Church their spiritual home are encouraged to attend.

We enjoyed meetings with various preachers, awesome praise & worship, and times where the Holy Spirit really moved among the youth. There were plenty of seminars covering many different topics, as well as lots of activities during the day and after the evening meetings.

Our youth took part in the football tournament and the obstacle course, along with enjoying the wacky warehouse full of inflatables, bandeeoke, games evening and much more.

On the last night we joined in the Christmas themed silent disco to end off a great week at DTI.

YOUTH NIGHT

In October 2022, we launched our very first Youth Night, with guest speaker, Josh Green. Our vision is to not only to ignite the faith in our own youth but to reach other youth and youth groups in our area and provide an evening for all young people to be encouraged in their faith and experience the Holy Spirit.

We've also had visiting youth worship bands to inspire the youth in their praise & worship. In June 2023, we had our second Youth Night, this time with Josh Guest and his church's youth band, and it was another very successful evening.

This was followed by a successful Youth Night on the 24th of September with Zeke Rink, a preacher and organiser from DTI.

CHURCHES TOGETHER IN MIDDLEWICH



Middlewich has five churches that meet every 3 to 4 months to pray and strategise fellowshiping together. These include St. Michael's (CofE), St. Mary's (RC), United Reformed Church, Middlewich Methodist and ourselves, MCC.

The meetings we have as church leaders, are always friendly, cordial, and the focus is always on Jesus Christ, as we have realised, we have more in common than what differentiates us.

BAPTISM SERVICE



In 2023, we have had two baptism events, where four people were baptised. We are hopeful that in 2024, we will have more people being baptised, as this is one of the indicators of how well, we as a church, are doing. It is Jesus who said, we should go out into the world and make disciples, "baptising" them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

The Greek word used for baptising, is baptizo. Meaning to immerse or submerge. As such we do not sprinkle babies with water but submerge those who have decided of their own accord to do so.

Our baptism services are done with children and guests in mind and God is glorified.

YOUTH MISSION (GERMANY)



On the 24th August we were privileged to go on a 3 night trip to visit The Elim Church (part of AoG) in Hamburg, Germany, to experience a large church youth group and the German culture. Six of our youth signed up for the adventure and along with three leaders, everyone had a great time!

We enjoyed a worship & prayer evening, Youth Night, church youth small groups and social, as well as sight-seeing. Their Youth Pastor, Jonas, looked after us and made us feel very welcome. It was a great experience for our youth, and we are very thankful for it.

KIDS CHURCH

Kids Church have enjoyed a few different series over the past year, where we have learnt about God and His word. In our 'Hey God' series, the kids were able to see that they can talk to God in any way, about anything, anytime, and anywhere.



It's as easy as saying, "Hey God!" They learnt that one way they can pray is by following the acronym PRAY - Praise, Repent, Ask, and YES!

Later we went into the Amazon jungle to watch the Amazonia challenge and take part in some of the challenges ourselves. This series was teaching the kids more about the character of God.

The kids have also learnt that God wants to be our best friend. Just like we spend time with our friends every day, we can spend time with God and grow our friendship with Him. We do that by Getting quiet, Reading His Word, Opening up our hearts to Him, and Worshipping = GROW.

When we do those things, our friendship with God will grow and we'll know how to follow Him! They have made many different crafts throughout our different series, including their own prayer journals.

Each week is full of full of fun-packed stuff, including singing & dancing, crafts, games, multimedia, and juice & biscuits all led by our amazing team of leaders.

Our vision is to help our kids & youth to GROW in the faith, KNOW God more and want to SHOW their faith to others. Our kids, along with the youth, spent the end of last year putting together a Christmas Nativity play for the church and the community.

GLOW PARTY

Last year's Glow Party was lots of fun. Instead of celebrating Halloween we provided an alternative celebration to celebrate Jesus and being a light in this world.

Whilst kids are out trick or treating and wearing scary costumes, we provide a party where kids can still dress up (no scary costumes) and enjoy dancing, games, sweets, activities, crafts, glow in the dark face paint or nail varnish, and a café.

The party is aimed at primary school aged children, but we encourage all our youth to come along and help run the party, so there's something for everyone.

We use this opportunity to show God's love to the children and adults and hand out gospel resources in our goodie bags.



KIDS & YOUTH MINISTRY



YOUTH CHURCH

Youth Church, which takes place on Sunday mornings alongside the main service, is a youth group where they dig deeper into God's word by taking part in a bible study, which includes activities and multimedia.

One of the series they have completed was called 'Sharpening Your Sword', where they learnt key scriptures and how they can use these in their daily lives to build up their faith, especially when times are hard. Currently they are working through a 'Bible Heroes' series, looking at the lives of certain men/women of God in the bible and comparing them to today's superheroes, but also learning we can all be used by God.

I am very grateful to our team of leaders who deliver these bible studies each week.



The children in Kids & Youth Church did an amazing job of performing 'The Christmas Mouse', which is a story about a mouse's journey up the Christmas tree and along the way she discovers what the real meaning of Christmas is. We had actors, singers, puppets, dancers and a stage crew, who all worked very hard to make it a wonderful morning for our church and community to come and enjoy.

Our leaders did an outstanding job of organising everything involved, including activities after the performance for everyone to enjoy. There were crafts, gingerbread men decorating and a Christmas photo booth.

Our aim is to make parents/carers feel welcome in a safe environment where they can relax and unwind whilst their little ones enjoy a morning of fun.

We do our best to encourage them on their parental journey and show God's love to them. The morning includes lots of toys, activities, baby area, soft play, snack or tea & coffee, craft time and is finished off with singing & dancing.

Over the past year a couple of our young adults and a couple of home educated youth have volunteered their time to help each Wednesday. Sometimes we also have young people from MoCoCo House come and volunteer.

I am also very grateful to Sue & Ken who prepare the crafts each week. These often come with little encouraging verses or scriptures. We love sharing God's love with our community and appreciate all the help we can get.



KIDS AND CARERS

Kids & Carers took place in the February half-term holidays this year. We find that this is the one holiday where not many people go away because of the weather. This is a great opportunity for us to throw an event for our community so we can show them God's love. This year we had a 'under the sea' theme and enjoyed activities, crafts, singing & dancing, prizes, and refreshments.

All the children received goodie bags which included gospel resources as well as a balloon to take home. Our youth volunteered to help, along with some wonderful people from the church and our conference centre team.

The purpose of the worship & sound team is to encourage and facilitate the glorification of God through worship by the congregation (which includes the worship team members). Our Life Groups have been an important part of our church life again this year. From September until April 2023, we have had five life groups meeting weekly throughout term time, except for the weeks when a Time of Refreshing meeting was held at church for everyone. Three of the groups continued to meet using Zoom for convenience, but two of them met face to face.

The three groups using Zoom were led by Chris Sellers and Paula on Tuesday evenings, and Faith on Wednesday evenings, whilst those meeting in person were led by Bridget, Helen and Chris Shepherd. The groups either made use of the excellent Bible study resources found on RightNowMedia, or they used their own Bible studies.

Bridget's group have met on Tuesday evenings at Richard's house. This group have enjoyed meeting together, learning and reminding themselves of great truths. Attendance averaged 9-10 people each week. Their studies have included a 'conversational' Bible study through the Book of James, 2 Chronicles 7:14 and a study on The End Times – a pre-tribulation view, the millennium and the second coming of the Lord.

Helen and Chris's group met at Helen's house on Tuesday afternoons. There have been 3 - 5 people who have attended. This group have studied Psalm 23, Psalm 65, Philemon, and Colossians. They have enjoyed the fellowship of meeting together, discussing and sharing experiences as they studied God's Word.

Faith's group were all mature Christians who have engaged in discussions and who have been invested in the group. Different people have led the studies alongside Faith. There have been 6 – 8 people at the meetings. This group has studied Colossians, Psalm 23, and Jenny Allen's 'God's Unbreakable Promises'.

I was struggling with my daughter going blind, the responsibility of a church being put upon me, and my husband being diagnosed with cancer. I felt if I was to lead God's church, I needed help and quickly. The church only had eight members after Covid and was struggling. Things got worse; I lost my job, and I lost my house. Then one prayer meeting when I was being verbally attacked for the wrong choice of song, my spirit shouted to God, I'm not meant to be a leader. A prophetic message came, saying that I needed to lift my hands like Moses to win the battle and two of my trusted church members would help me.

That was the turning point. I applied for MIT as advised by my Hub leaders. I did not know how I was going to afford it. There were initial queries about my application which brought back all my doubts but then it turned out even better than I imagined with your sponsorship and a travel bursary. The MIT first year has been brilliant. My coaching group is so supportive and encouraging- I love them all. The training has been inspiring and challenging. I have tried to put into practice what I have been taught. God is building His church; we are now regularly over 20. We also had our first baptism service in 15 years. Six people were baptised. On a personal level my daughter is back in church teaching the Bible study, my husband's operation has resulted in him being cancer free and we now have a smaller but lovely home.

Building on our successful 2022 season we held our Annual AGM in January 2023, where we appointed new committee members and made changes to our Constitution to reflect the progress required in the future.

We welcomed 2 new groups of bowlers; Bostock Ladies (Mid Cheshire league) and the local Farmers bowling team, bringing a membership total to 70+.



Our club secretary also entered two new teams in the afternoon Vets Crewe and Nantwich bowling league. Both teams achieving fantastic results in their first season. One team reaching the top of their division and the other team finishing third, also, our treasurer winning the highest average score out of 100+ players.

The year started well, with a new Chairman and new Treasurer being elected. Unfortunately, due to personal circumstances the Chairman resigned in June and took time out from bowling for the rest of the season. Thus, one of our challenges is to appoint a new Chairperson and to achieve a quality bowling surface to league standard.

We have created a 5-year plan for the club titled, A Journey of Change. This will encompass our aims, projects, and challenges in the future.

Via our clubs Reach Out programme, we engaged with the local community to raise the profile of our activities, one of which was partnering with Middlewich Voluntary Services, attending their meetings and having a stall at their event.

We managed to set up a stand at the Middlewich Folk and Boat festival, taking a few names and contact details thus organising a social/training afternoon with refreshments and it was enjoyed by all. Hopefully we will try to arrange it again when the new season begins April 2024.

MIDDLEWICH COMMUNITY BOWLING CLUB continued

One of our challenges was to provide funding for some of our projects, we applied and were successful in receiving funding from the following organisations: - Middlewich Town Council, British Crown Green Bowling Association, and Middlewich Vision. The monies received will be used for:

- Upgrading our outside toilet to a fully accessible toilet facility.
- Purchase of a mobile irrigation system
- Purchase of a spiking machine
- Upgrade our bowling green Floodlights to LED lights.

Work has progressed on the toilet facilities with a lot of hard work being carried out including repanelling, new Marley tile floor fitted, accessible toilet, new sink with grab handles and locks to be fitted asap.

Working with Pastor Antony our close partnership with the Church continues. A fun afternoon with the Church was very successful, the Church providing a lovely buffet and the weather was kind to us. Many thanks to Pastor Antony and all his staff.

A painting programme to repaint all the fences around the green and building, was agreed in conjunction with Pastor Antony, the new paintwork being the Church's corporate colours.

Many thanks to our hard-working Friday gang (average age 75), who continue with their good work and without them we couldn't maintain the premises to such a high standard.

Our next task is setting up a website, which we aim to have completed by the end of March, this will hopefully attract new members. Like most clubs finding and retaining members is challenging and we have now made steps towards an on-line presence by creating a website for the bowling club.



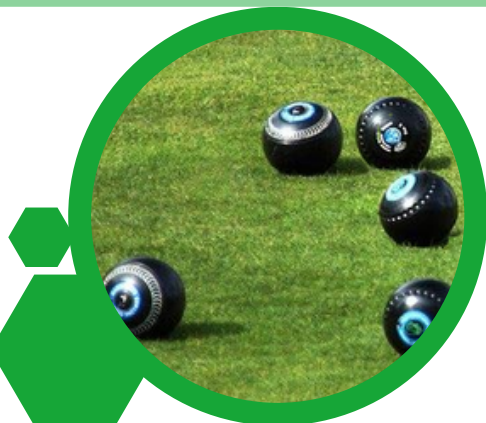

THE LIGHTHOUSE CENTRE (TLC) CREWE

The Lighthouse Centre has continued to provide community outreach for the people in the community for the past twelve months.

We have continued to collect food from various supermarkets which include Waitrose, Tesco, Greggs, KFC, Nando's, on different days of the week. The church minibus is used to make these collections daily and the food items are stored onsite and prepared for Tuesdays and Thursdays. We also pull together food parcels for those who turn up in the week.

On Wednesdays, every week, people from various backgrounds including refugees and asylum seekers struggling with food poverty, attend the church to receive lunches and food parcels. We also share the gospel and deliver bible study after the lunch time session. On average 20 people attend per week, which amounts to 1,040 people per annum.

On Thursday evenings dinners are prepared again for those in the community, who receive two courses. The first course is from Greggs which is collected on a Wednesday evening and the main course is prepared from chicken from Nando's.

We have on average 22 people attending each week, which amounts to 1,144 people per annum. We have several volunteers who give of their time every week to not only prepare the food, but also serve. A message is always prepared to share with those who attend on a Thursday and is greatly received.

Therefore, we have in total 2,184 people who attend the sessions each year. Food parcels are delivered every Thursday to several families who are in need. 30, This year we have supported the youth by attending National Youth Retreat and taking them to gospel open air events, to not only create inclusion, but also to encourage their engagement with other youth who are new to the Crewe area.



The cost of the minibus lease has increased to £432.00 per month, which increased from July 2022. The minibus has been used to transport attendees to conventions in Newport and facilitated the transport of equipment for our annual Valley Park Festival, which is next to the Flag Lane Baths, which is a project linked to The Lighthouse Centre and Always Ahead Charity.

We have developed a good relationship with UCB, who have utilised the minibus when they had students over from abroad for a few days. We are looking at ways that we can increase the use of the vehicle, which will service not just the ministries in church at The Lighthouse, but also the community. At present we are looking at arranging trips with a few of the men who attend the Wednesday and Thursdays, as a way of befriending and being Christ's hand extended, bringing light to many who sit in darkness.

We at The Lighthouse Centre have greatly appreciated the financial support we have received to fund the lease of the minibus and it has proven to be an invaluable asset to us. We hope and pray that this investment into our church ministry may continue by God's grace.

Our feeding programme continues, made possible by our regular donors. It costs £5 to feed a child for a month, meaning that a nutritious meal is provided during the school day

Other projects including our bee project and gardens, continue to be fruitful, and provide produce to sell at market, as well as extra nutrition for the meals.

NICK & DAISY MURIRO - YOUTH WITH A MISSION (YWAM)

2023 was another exciting year of life and ministry. Our ministry took us to Uganda twice, South Sudan, Zimbabwe, and South Africa. In this season, our ministry is primarily teaching and training other missionaries. We are passionate about it because some of those missionaries then take the gospel to places, we may never be able to go ourselves.

One of Nick's leadership responsibilities is overseeing YWAM's bible training programs on the continent of Africa. They meet every two years to pray, dream, and strategize about reaching Africa with the gospel.

Our team from Uganda has a vision of reaching all the 900 islands of Lake Victoria with the gospel through bible distribution, teaching, and evangelism. So far, they have gone to 80 islands and have distributed 8,460 bibles. Our team from South Africa joined them on 3 of these islands.

For years I have not been able to teach or minister in Europe because of visa constraints. This year I was able to go and teach in Amsterdam and will be going again this coming year.

For the past 3 and half years, Nick has juggled ministry responsibilities and studies. Two weeks ago, he graduated with a Masters degree in Christian Spiritual Formation and Discipleship. These studies have helped him immensely in his ministry of discipleship and teaching.

Challenges:

- Our training programs throughout Africa, particularly in South Africa continue to face challenges with getting visas for our students as borders thicken. This has negatively affected student numbers.
- We have struggled to maintain a balance between ministry and family this year. As it has been a busy year of ministry and school for the children. With the year coming to an end, we are feeling quite tired and looking forward to things closing down and having some time to rest.
- Financial support is an ongoing challenge, but we are thankful for what we have been able to do and the places we have visited this year. My family and I are incredibly grateful for the support that we receive from MCC.

MALAWI

BISHOP MOSES - CHRISTIAN FAITH COMMUNITY CHURCH

MANGOCHI MINISTRY UNDER PASTOR BOSTON JOSEPH

- 14 members in the church ministry are being disciplined.
- 18 members of the community are in the Fellowship ministry.
- 26 poorest and neediest persons have been reached out with physical, spiritual and psychological support.
- Pastor's house building project is not at a roofing level.

NKHOTAKOTA MINISTRY UNDER PASTOR PRINCE POFERA

- 113 members of the church are being disciplined by Pastor Prince Pofera at Nkhunga.
- A new church has been started and 18 church members are being disciplined at Ngala branch by Agness Mhone.
- Another new church has been started and 28 members at Chidebwe branch are being disciplined by Stella Banda.



PASTORS SUPPORT

- 2 local pastors are being supported monthly with 50 USD each to supplement their daily budgets and needs.

SOME CHALLENGES AND ON-GOING PRESSURES

- Lack of resources to support the poorest and neediest persons in Mangochi.
- Cholera pandemics along lakeshore districts which also affected growth of churches.
- Lack of proper place for local church meetings at both Ngala and Chidebwe new church centres in Nkhotakota.

PRAYERS FOR FUTURE PLANS

- A continued supply of God's resources for the support of the neediest and poorest persons in Mangochi.
- Ability to source out funds to buy pieces of land where meeting shelters can be temporarily erected at Ngala and Chidebwe churches in Nkhotakota.
- Extension of Nkhunga church where Prince is overseeing.

SUNFLOWER TRUST KENYA

The Sunflower Trust is supporting three pastors and 37 children. As a result of this support, Pastor Stephen Lukeele based in Samburu, was gifted with a motorbike. This has led to five churches being planted, which he now oversees.



In Kakamega, Evangelist Stephen Mutuli, as a result of our support, has been able to rent three mud huts and he looks after twelve orphans. Our monthly contribution, enables him to buy food for the children and also pay for school fees.

Finally, we support Pastor Joseph Lumumba, who has a ministry for people living with HIV in the HIV ghetto region of Kisumu. We fund 20 children in this needy part of the world with food, medication and educational fees.

The majority of the children's mothers were raped and contracted HIV, some of the mothers sadly died within two or three years of contracting the disease. Others, finding themselves pregnant at the age of 15 or 16, abandoned their children, facing no chance of supporting them due to lack of food, shelter and financial support.



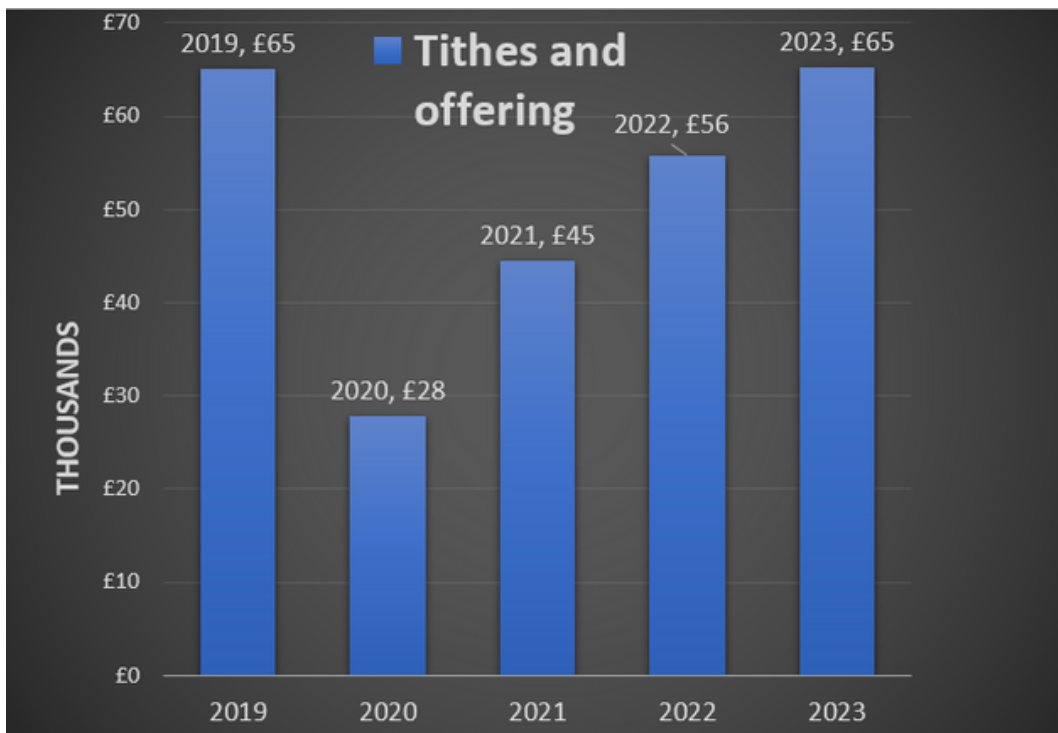

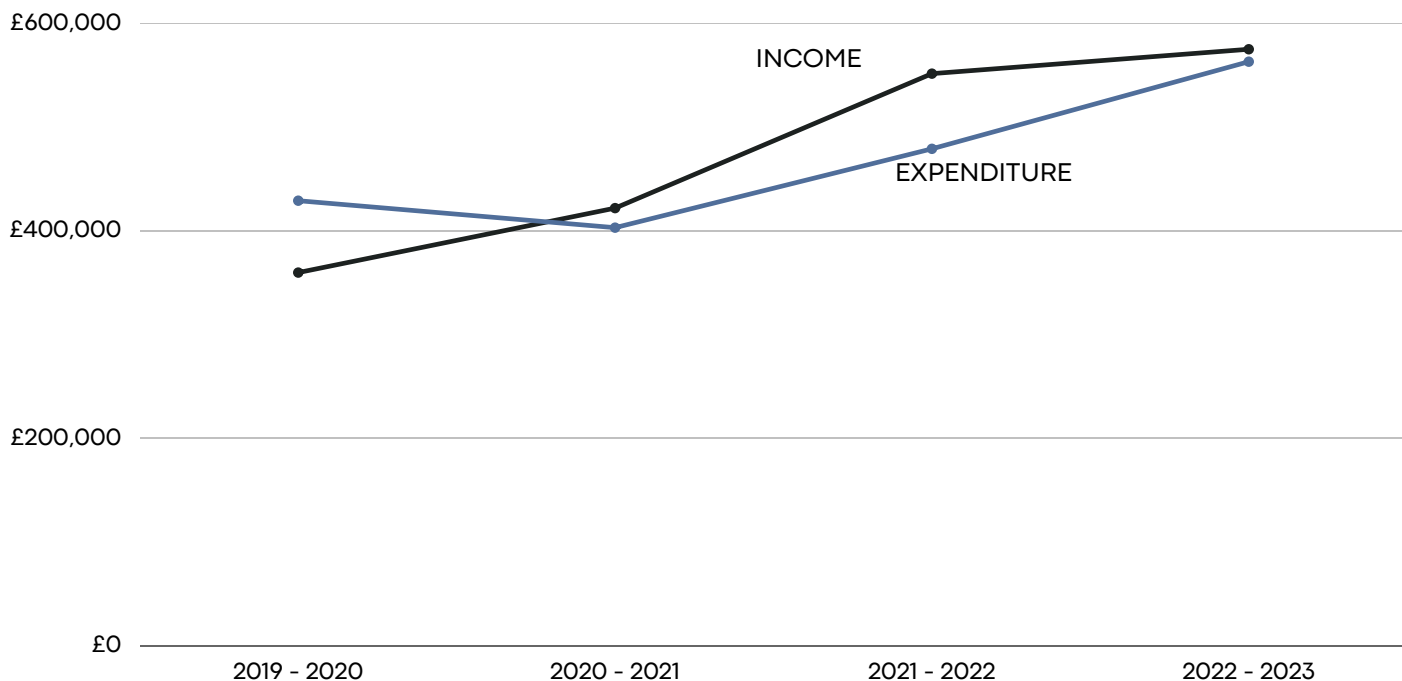
